1 When I open a html file via the command line: `chromium-browser "file:///myhtmlfile.html"`, the file opens and appears correctly, however, a simple slider control on the page does not behave as expected. (It does not react to touch screen correctly.)

▼ If I then open another tab in the same chromium window, and navigate to the same file and open it in the second tab, it behaves as expected.

🔖
🔄 When using the dev tools, I don't see any differences. The browser is not loading the file into the browser in the same manner.

Does anyone have a good explanation for this?
