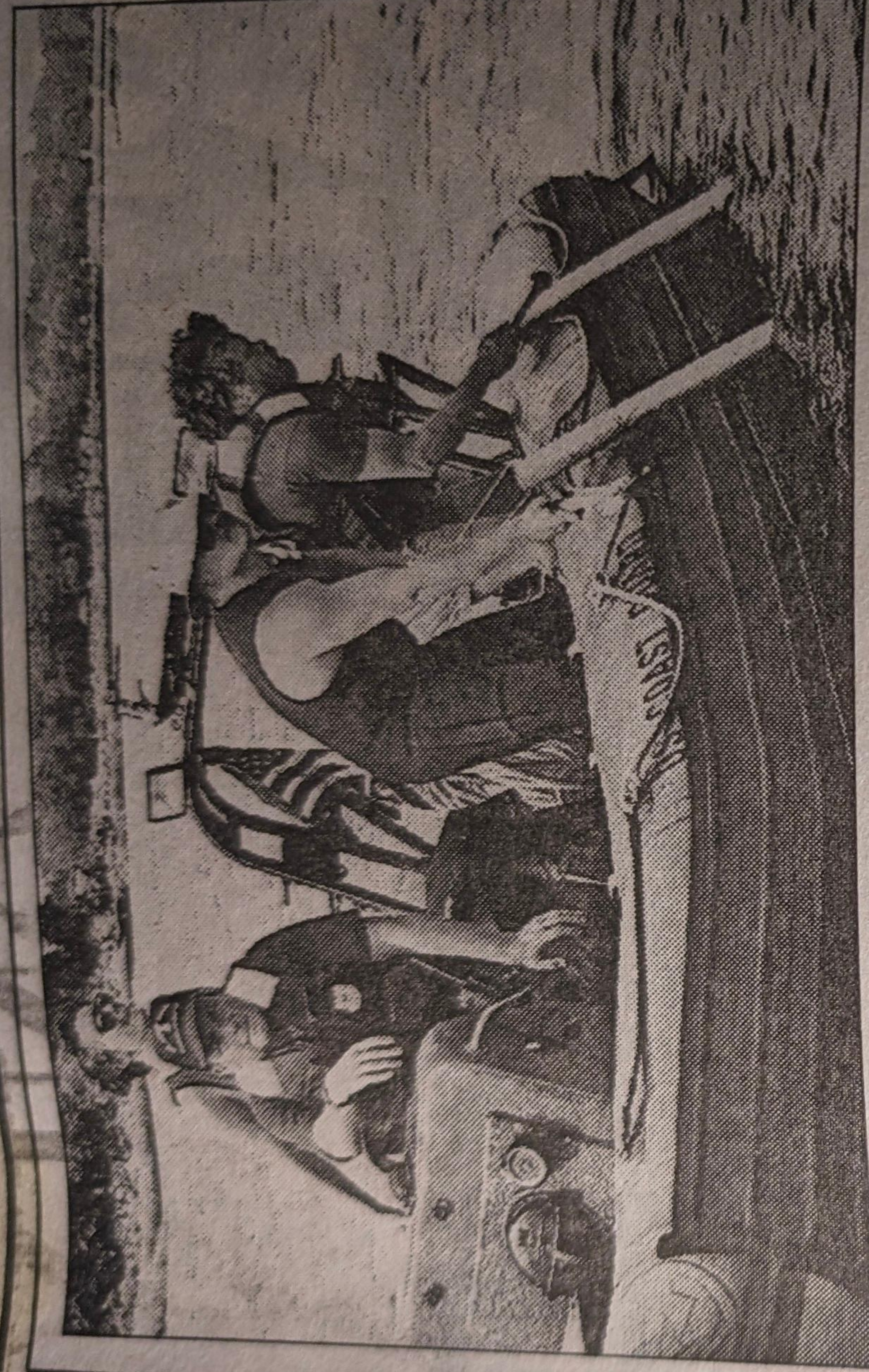

Willy the Whale finds city life a very sharking experience

Willy the Whale appeared stressed out yesterday.

How New York of him!

The pilot whale spent the day off Orchard Beach in the Bronx as marine rescue crews gathered 'round, hoping to send him back to the more peaceful waters of the Atlantic Ocean.

By late yesterday afternoon, Willy found a comfortable cove off the Twin Island area of the beach, and kept a low profile in the 75-degree water.

Around 4:45 p.m., five divers from the Okeanos Ocean Research Foundation surrounded Willy and coaxed him out to Long Island Sound, off the New Rochelle shore. As the young whale turned and headed

towards deeper waters, one of the divers yelled, "Go Willie, go."

Swim to the beat

Other Okeanos volunteers lowered 4-foot-long metal tubes into the water and began banging on them with hammers, hoping that the noise would send Willy scurrying toward the Atlantic.

Sam Sandove, Okeanos' director, said Willy may have developed a touch of pneumonia due to the stress he suffered over the past few days. Last weekend the whale split off from its pod, a group of more than a dozen other whales, and cruised the shallow waters of the Long Island Sound.

Sandove also said that Willy may have some water in his lungs.

As darkness fell, the whale rescuers lost sight of Willie about 4 miles south of Orchard beach.
